

# Surgery Overview

# 1. <u>Thank you for trusting Dr. Sharma to perform your surgery</u>.

- Surgery is never an easy decision. Dr. Sharma takes your trust very seriously and understands how important and overwhelming this can be.
- For any surgery to work, you must be comfortable with the plan.

#### 2. <u>Make sure you are completely comfortable with the decision to proceed with surgery</u>.

- If you have any questions or uncertainty, do not hesitate to ask.
- You can also request a pre-operative appointment with Dr. Sharma's PA to review the surgery and go over the postoperative care, if you want.

#### 3. Every surgery has risk.

- While the risks tend to be low overall, there is always risk.
- The risks can be grouped into infection, bleeding, anesthesia, and then risks specific to the surgery itself. Dr. Sharma reviewed the risks and benefits of surgery with you in clinic.
- If you have any questions about the risks, please let us know.

#### 4. <u>There is never a 100% guarantee any surgery will work.</u>

- Dr. Sharma only offers surgery if he believes, in his judgment, that the likelihood of the surgery improving you and your symptoms far exceeds the chance it will not.
- However, there is never a complete guarantee any surgery will work by any surgeon, and you
  may end up dissatisfied with the outcome.

# 5. <u>Following the postoperative instructions is as important to the outcome of the surgery as the surgery itself.</u>

- You will be given a written copy of these on the day of surgery.
- Make sure you comply with the instructions as strictly and specifically as possible. If you have any questions, please let us know.
- 6. Lifting more than instructed, even once, can completely negate a perfectly performed surgery.
  - With many surgeries, you only get one good shot the first time to maximize success, making compliance most important.
- 7. Narcotics and other pain medications are prescribed for 6 weeks only after surgery.
  - Dr. Sharma is not trained in the management of chronic pain, which requires its own unique expertise. Therefore, it's not safe for us to prescribe chronic pain medications long-term.

# 8. Work restrictions are given until the incisions have healed.

• We are not trained in evaluation and management of permanent disability and/or impairment ratings, and therefore it's not safe or appropriate for us to perform this.
